Dear Biden Commission on Reforming the U.S. Supreme Court,

I respectfully request that the Commission on reforming the U.S. Supreme Court protect civil society from abuse by judges. My story @ [REDACTED] documents Michigan family court judges' abuse of power and blowing the whistle on the connivance between power and politics. Michigan Democratic State Representative Stone read my book and responded on November 19, 2019: "With that all said, it is still well documented that either recourse is an uphill, and sometimes impossible, battle for a person when looking for judicial recourse and is in need of reform." **REPARATION BILLS
PREDATOR JUDGES, THEIR JUDICIARIES,
and COLOR of LAW ACTORS**

The erosion of the rule of law is one of the most important civil and human rights issue of our time. Judges, their judiciaries (protectors) and the color of law actors (court officers/attorneys) within America's legal system who have violated the supremacy of the Constitution or law, must be held to redress for their heinous crimes against civil liberties. It is time to hold these public servants accountable for long-term widespread fraud and liable to their victims. Contact your Attorney General, State Senate Judiciary Committee, and Governor's office to establish reparations:

- Congressional oversight for effective avenues of redress for victims of legal system abuse
- National retroactive judicial accountability bill
- National state audit of judicial tenure commissions
- National state audit of state and federal appellate courts
- National parent-child protection bill
- National shared physical and legal child custody bill
- National defunding of the Federal Social Security Act, Title IV-D, 42 United States Code ("incentive payments" to United States State Court's for performance- based child support collection)
- National alimony reform
