Dear Senator Slotkin,

Thank you for your response February 18, 2026, to my inquiry and for your attention to this matter.

I understand the distinction between the roles of the legislature and the judiciary, and I appreciate your guidance on seeking legal counsel. However, the issue I am raising involves significant potential **federal fraud** related to **Title IV-D funding** and the **systemic abuse of legal processes** at the state level—issues that go beyond typical civil matters and implicate both constitutional rights and federal law.

The **lack of consent** in the court's actions, specifically regarding the entry of a judgment without my signature or valid consent, raises serious concerns regarding the **misuse of federal funds** designed to enforce child support under the **Title IV-D program**. Federal incentives provided to states for child support enforcement have been linked to legal actions that may not meet the necessary requirements under federal law, such as the unlawful imposition of retroactive child support and the **non-consensual execution of agreements**.

As a member of the **Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee**, your office plays a key role in overseeing matters of **government accountability and public integrity**, which are **directly implicated in this case**. The **failure of the judicial system** to address these violations, and the ongoing enforcement of **void judgments**, highlights a **systemic problem** in the state's legal practices, which may be exacerbated by federal financial incentives. I believe that **federal oversight** is necessary to ensure compliance with the law and to **protect citizens from fraudulent legal practices that involve the misuse of both state and federal resources**.

While I understand the separation of powers, I respectfully request your **assistance in initiating a federal investigation** into the **misuse of Title IV-D funds** and the **lack of due process** in my case. These issues not only affect me but also have far-reaching implications for other individuals in similar circumstances. As a **whistleblower** and a victim of this ongoing fraud, I am seeking an impartial, federal-level investigation that can address the legal, financial, and ethical concerns involved.

I am prepared to provide any additional documentation and information to support this investigation. I hope you will consider advocating for greater oversight and accountability, ensuring that federal resources are not being misused, and that all citizens are protected from abuses within the judicial system.

Thank you again for your time and attention. I look forward to your response and assistance your office may be able to provide in addressing this critical issue.
