Dear Christine Morrison:

This is in response to your complaint to the HHS Office of Inspector General (OIG) received on April 15, 2026. The OIG referred your complaint to the Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE). Your complaint alleges misuse of federal title IV-D funds and fraud in the Michigan family court.

The local child support office maintains the case information. Our office does not have the authority to access this information.

OCSE does not:

- Conduct federal reviews of state compliance based on individual case complaints
- Investigate specific cases of alleged state nonperformance
- Make determinations about corrective action for individual cases
- Handle direct enforcement actions in individual cases.

What we will do: We'll contact the state(s) involved to get information about your case and respond to you in writing. It may take time if your case involves more than one state.

We will contact you if we need more information from you.
